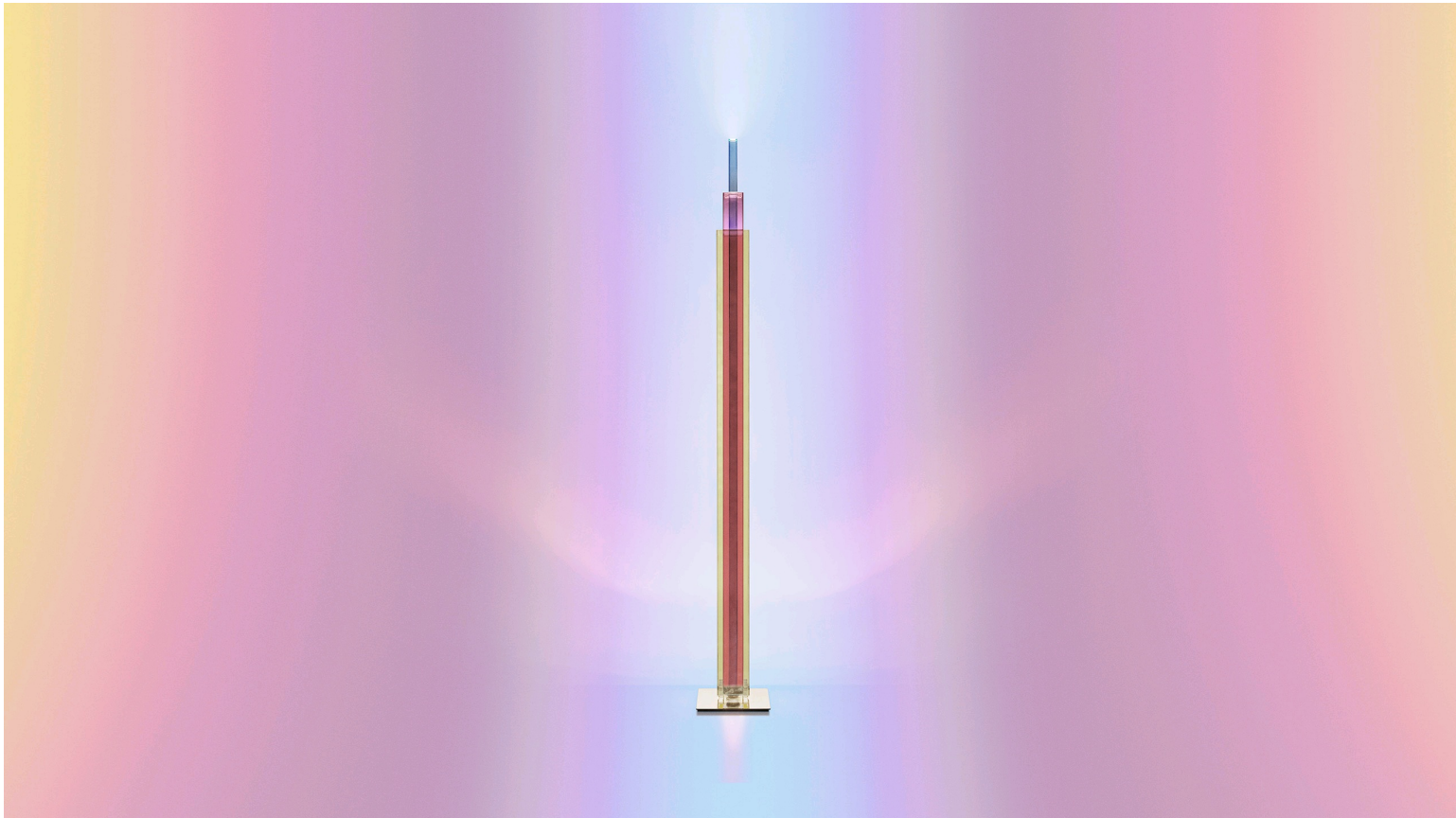


Uptown, terra

DESCRIPTION

The Uptown lamp has an imposing presence. A composition of three coloured glass slab bodies in shades of yellow, primary red and blue which, overlapping one another, give rise to new colourful hues. Charming even when it is switched off, Uptown comes to life and plays the starring role in its surroundings when it is switched on. The lamp lights up, the slabs fill up with colour and the light is projected up. Even the base stands out thanks to the extra-polished stainless steel used to make it, which reflects the colours and the graphic sign of the lamp body. Transparency is the leitmotiv underpinning the entire design; the 45° cut makes the meeting point between the glass slabs imperceptible. What cannot be seen, and appears not to exist, has been purposely concealed to make a highly complex object appear straightforward.

MATERIALS

Painted glass, stainless steel and PMMA

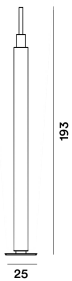
COLORS

multicolour (yellow/red/blue)

Floor lamp with indirect and semi-diffused light. The lamp body consists of three parallelepipeds made from painted glass cut at 45 degrees, bonded and placed on a transparent polyurethane resin base for optical use. The three elements are secured to the top by three transparent PMMA caps. Base with metal ballast covered with polished stainless steel. The COB LEDs are housed in an aluminium plate and they are protected by an anti-glare metal frame. Black dimmer and transformer on the black power supply cable. Packed in OSB wooden crate.
